Trachoma is a contagious disease, spreading through contact with the eyes, eyelids, and nose or throat secretions of infected people. Untreated trachoma can lead to blindness. A leading cause of Trachoma is poor sanitary conditions, inadequate access to water, and lack of hygiene, such as unclean faces or hands.

To help prevent this disease we are asking for donations of: •Shampoo and conditioner.

•Hand soap and a soap container.

•Toothbrush, toothpaste and a toothbrush holder. •Hair brush/ comb and deodorant (non aerosol)

Please drop your donations to the office in week 6 (this week) and week 7 (next week).

Our aim is to collect 70 bags in total. So, all donations big or small from the list above are welcomed.
