Principal's report

A very busy term

It is hard to believe we are almost half way through our first term. The year is progressing very quickly.

Hopefully by the time this is being read we will have held another successful swimming carnival on Monday with little to no rain having dampened the spirits of students and teachers on the day. If so, then students that placed first or second will be competing at the Zone Swimming in Lismore. If not, then those students that placed their names down with the PE staff will be there. Either way, we wish all students well.

A reminder that any student who missed their photo on Friday 14th Feb will have another opportunity this Friday 21st February. Also the Year 12 group photo will be rescheduled due to the weather.

On Tuesday 25th February we are holding our Year 7 welcome BBQ. This is an opportunity for Year 7 parents/carers to come to school and meet their child's teachers. More information will be sent to families this week. On Wednesday 26th February we are holding our year 5 and year 6 into 7 information evening. Information about this event will be sent to families via our neighbouring primary schools, advertisements in local media, our facebook page and our school website. We are very excited to be meeting with families at these upcoming events. Also on Wednesday 26th February at 7pm will be the first meeting for the Parents and Citizens (P&C) of Alstonville High School. Everyone is welcome.

Professional learning for staff

This week our Head Teachers have reflected on their performance and development plans for the year through the use of generative dialogue with staff from Byron Bay High School. Later in the term, staff will be working with Dr David Townsend from Canada, and Mr David Silcock. Our literacy and numeracy team will continue their collaboration with David and David as we review what the data tells us about the effectiveness of our strategies to date and how we can ramp up our approach further for 2020. Other teams, including our Aboriginal Education, School Promotion & Transition, Steam & Curriculum, Student Wellbeing and Work, Health & Safety teams will also be discussing aspects of their teams goals as they seek to maximise the impact of their approaches for 2020. We will also be working with authors and academics Kurtis and Lorna Hewson. They have developed what is called the Collaborative Response Model of student support. This model has heavily influenced the development of our school plan and refinements we are making to collaboratively support our students with personalised learning plans. Kurtis and Lorna have travelled all the way from Edmonton at their own expense and are providing their expertise free of charge to our school. They are also bringing a range of resources to share with our team.

Sentral Parent portal

We aware that that some of our parents are experiencing some difficulties accessing the SENTRAL parent portal. We have been working with a small group of parents over the last couple of weeks to understand what have been some of the barriers and to actually see what parents can see because our view of the program is quite different. We have been making some changes to the way the information is organised on the parent portal to simplify the way information appears. We are also developing a range of instructions to provide to parents that will provide additional support. We will also be including some information and help sessions as part of our organisation for the year 7 BBQ. We hope that by the end of this term many more parents will be able to access the portal easily, and that we can improve this aspect of our communication strategy. If you have any feedback, questions or suggestions related to using the parent portal please ring the school office and talk to our staff who will pass your issues onto the team working on this project.

Deputy's Report – HSC Administrator

Dear Parents & Guardians,

As current Year 12 Deputy Principal and HSC Administrator, I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to another year. Indeed, as stated by Mr John Parker, it's hard to believe that we are well on our way to March and our Year 12's are moving rapidly toward completion of their studies.

At this time of year, it is important to remind both parents/guardians and students that the **New South Wales Education and Standards Authority (NESAS)** mandates that all schools develop a school assessment program and policy that maintains strict guidelines in relation eligibility for HSC study. This includes the number of subjects required to fulfil the award of the HSC course as well as ATAR eligibility and requirements for eligibility regarding the record of school achievement or ROSA.

In particular, a range of assessment procedures are detailed in our assessment booklet. These are additionally explicitly communicated to students at the beginning of the HSC year back in Term 4. While there is a great deal of information listed in the assessment booklet, it is important that all parents, guardians and students are familiar with illness/misadventure requirements for example also understanding the way in which malpractice is administered and N Award notifications are distributed to name a few.

If you have any questions about the nature of assessment or administrative practices and requirements pertaining to this year's HSC course of study, please do not hesitate to contact me at the school or the respective Head Teachers of each faculty who are also most willing to assist.










AHS Non Negotiables – reminder for parents

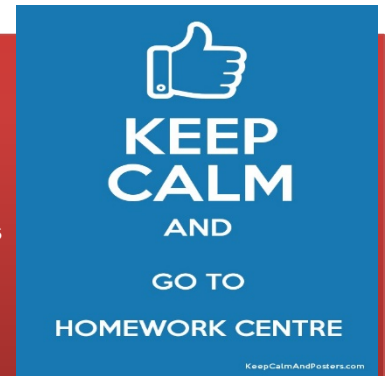

Careers Communication Corner

TVET Tafe 2020 Years 10,11 and 12

Reminder to all students who have commenced TAFE this year or are continuing from last year. It is up to students/families to pay for transport when students access special TAFE timetabled or public bus services to and from TAFE. This was listed on TAFE application forms signed by families. Some school buses MAY accept school bus passes if already on that route. TAFE course costs are covered by Department of Education unless students are from private schools. Attendance is compulsory each week. If absent, you need to notify TAFE AND bring a note to school as you would for normal absences. Students attending all day classes go direct to TAFE. Explained absences/cover notes, are placed on the school system as follows: (NOTE) Students attending afternoon classes are listed as flexible leave from 12:00pm if you are catching the bus to TAFE from school bus bay. If you are getting a lift to TAFE, you need to let school know as you should remain in Period 3 class until 12:30pm.

Agriculture News



The photo showing the corn crop depicts the effect of irrigation – the irrigator did not cover the edges of the crop paddock and resulted in a decline in growth towards the fence boundaries

The school farm had a mixed forage crop planted prior to the rains which has resulted in good germination and growth which reinforces the benefit of weather forecasts and decision making.



Year 8 students have been shown the school farm and have been introduced to a range of inputs and agricultural outputs or products.

Year 9 students are studying commercial cropping and they will establish a mixed crop in coming weeks.

Year 10 students are visiting a local apiary (bee nursery) which is situated in town in a permaculture setting. They will undertake a range of activities involved in beekeeping.



Year 11 have been inducted into the course and are starting their work health and safety unit. The emergence of a buffalo fly pest situation in our breeding cattle led to immediate action and students were asked to perform ear tagging operations during their first lesson in class

Year 12 students completed their work placements and were provided authentic experiences to work at an industry standard in a number of agricultural enterprises including – veterinary practice, dairy operations, DPI and livestock, market gardening and floriculture. The difficult weather conditions complemented the experience with contingency planning arrangements and decision making in practice.

The study is being run by researchers at the Black Dog Institute <http://www.blackdoginstitute.org.au/> at the University of New South Wales, along with over 100 schools in NSW, to better understand the changes that take place in mental health from early adolescence to adulthood. Students in the study will also trial mental health apps that may help identify and prevent symptoms of depression and anxiety.

The results of this study have real potential to inform government policy and the scientific community. For this reason, we are keen to get a good representation from Alstonville High School.
